Waterloo, NY 13165 We the undersigned respectfully submit our nomination of **Charlotte Rosalie Reigles** of Owego, New York for induction into the NYSHPA Hall of Fame as a pitcher. She has been a member of the NYSHPA since 1985. As an active member of the Southern Tier Horseshoe Club and the Pits Indoor Club, Charlotte was among the best of pitchers in the Binghamton area. When these clubs disbanded in 1993, she would become a life member of the Tri-County Horseshoe Club in Groton. As an elite A Class pitcher during the eighties and nineties, she was consistently ranked by the NYSHPA in the top 10 of the women's division; at her best, she averaged more than 60 percent ringers and had game highs greater than 70 percent. Although she did not win a NYS Championship, she had competitive success against the likes of Lorraine Thomas, Ruth Hangen, Sue Twyman, Betty Steinfelt, Traci Warters Hastings, and Karen Graham. In addition to competing in 13 NYS Championships, Charlotte also competed in 3 NHPA World Tournaments.

Charlotte was 42 years old when she was introduced to competitive horseshoes by husband Charles E. Reigles, who was impressed by her extraordinary 'eye to hand' coordination. She entered her first tournament at Statesville, SC in 1985. With each subsequent competitive event, her ringer percentage dramatically improved. During the years to follow, she traveled and competed in tournaments in West Virginia, Ohio and Pennsylvania, as well as New York. Charlotte tied for first in the 1987 Ohio Ringer's Classic in Greenville, Ohio with Lois Webster, but placed second with a lower ringer percentage. Charlotte competed in Dallas PA tournaments at least 15 times; she was undefeated in Class A in 1987 and was the tournament champion four other times. Testimony to her elite pitching ability was her participation in the Art Tyson Invitational Tournament in NYC during the nineties; her match win against Walter Ray Williams Jr. at the 1994 Las Vegas Hacienda Open; and her competitiveness in the 1998 Walt Shackleton Memorial when she pitched more than 70 percent ringers in three of her 5 matches.

Charlotte competed in 13 NYS Championships and 3 NHPA World Tournaments during 1985 through 1998. Details of her competitive stats are limited because tournament results were not available on line prior to 2003. She competed in her first State Tournament in 1985, winning Women Class C (5-0-50.6%). The next year, she moved up to compete in Women A, placing 7th in 1986 (51.3% ringers) and 1987, 6th in 1988 (60% ringers), and 4th in 1990 (5-3-57.4%). Charlotte would place 2nd in 1991 (54.5%), 1992 (6-1-65.4%), 1993 (61.2%), and 1994 (59%); she placed 3rd in 1995 (60.5%), 1996, and 1998 (51%); her ringer percentage in 1997 was 55.35. During the 1990 championship, Charlotte was tied for 1st place with Ruth Hangen, Sue Twyman, and Carrie Carpenter, but placed 4th in the playoff.

In regard to World Tournaments, she placed 5th in Women C Class in 1990 (Georgia). She competed in Women A Class in 1992 (Ohio) and 1994 (New York), carrying an average of 60% ringers in both tournaments. In Columbus, Ohio 1992 Charlotte started in Women's C-1, advanced to Prelims where she shot 64%, to advance again to A-1 where she didn't win any games, but still pitched a respectable 60%.

Charlotte had won multiple tournaments at the Pits and, with its closure in 2001, would gravitate with her husband to compete on the Tri-County Club's indoor courts. Beginning in 2009, she competed in 6 sanctions at the Tri-County Horseshoe club, placing 2nd in A Class 5 times. She and her team mate placed in the 'top 3' of the club's walking doubles tournaments 31 times, winning her class 13 times. Her last competitive event at Tri-County was on October 19, 2019. To the last pitch at the club, her eye to hand coordination was impressive, but she had lost strength in her legs.

Charlotte became a regular scorekeeper at the club's tournaments and, more often than naught, could be found on Court 8. She was a source of encouragement for competitors and was willing to offer her advice when they asked. Her love for the game of horseshoes and commitment to the club were shared by her husband of 61 years and their son Charlie. On April 15, 2015, Tr-County's Board of Director acknowledged their importance to the club at the Reigles Family Annual Appreciation Tournament.

In our view, the long history of Charlotte's participation in competitive events, elite pitching skills, and wonderful rapport with players on and off the courts, justify her inclusion in the NYSHPA Hall of Fame, July 14, 2023
