



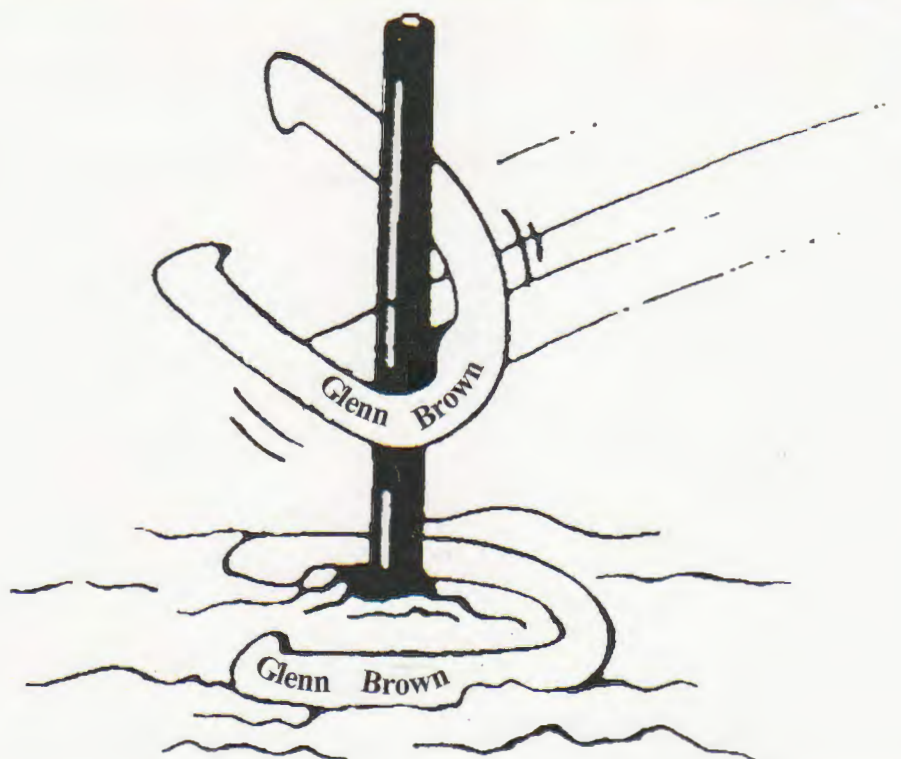

Glenn has been an NHPA member since 1984 and a member of the Syracuse Pioneer Club since 1983. He was a NYSHPA Hall of Fame Committee member for several years and an active member of the Pioneer Club Board of Directors until his retirement. Also he was tournament director at the Pioneer Club for three years.

Glenn was instrumental in remodeling an old barn at the Pioneer Club's present day indoor courts. He devoted countless hours assembling and dismantling the raised courts during the 1994 World Tournament hosted by the Pioneer Club.

Glenn is a retired plumber from Local 267 after 38 years of service. He also was instrumental in installing the plumbing at the Pioneer Club.

Glenn likes all sports and participated in most of them while in school. While playing baseball in high school he was a pitcher. After graduation he joined the Post Standard Baseball League.

Glenn and Betty were married October 10, 1948.

In 1992 when Walton hosted the New York State Championship Tournament, Glenn arrived a few days early to assist the club in getting set up for the tournament. In 1990 he directed two sanctioned tournaments at the Pioneer Club in one day making it possible for many to compete in the world tournament held at Stone Mountain, Ga. Glenn also competed in that tournament and since that time has missed only one World Tournament.

While he and Betty live in Florida during the winter months, Glenn travels over 2000 miles to compete in tournaments. On their way traveling back North, Statesville, N.C. is a must stop for Glenn to compete in the Dogwood Tournament. He averages 30 -35 tournaments annually.

In 1996 Glenn finished 1st.- Class C at Eastern National. He also had high % game of 88.5% in 1999 Camden Open.

Considering the countless hours of voluntary services promoting wherever and whenever needed and serving as a great ambassador to the NYSHPA by participating in the many, many tournaments, we the signers, feel Glenn Brown is deserving to be inducted into the NYSHPA Hall of Fame.
